

MODIFIED DECISION OF THE AUTHORITY IN THE MATTER OF ADJUSTMENT OF POWER PURCHASE PRICE FOR THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER 2008 OF FAISALABAD ELECTRIC SUPPLY COMPANY LIMITED (FESCO)

Federal Government, pursuant to Section 31(4) of the Regulation of Generation, Transmission and Distribution of Electric Power Act (XL of 1997) required the Authority to reconsider its decision with respect to the adjustment on account of variation in Power Purchase Price for the month of November, 2008 in respect of Faisalabad Electric Supply Company Ltd. (FESCO) communicated to the Federal Government vide letter No. NEPRA/TRF-40/FESCO-2005/71-74 dated January 1, 2009 for notification in the official gazette. Federal Government sought reconsideration for the following:

- i) The enblock proposed adjustment will result in further reduction in the already heavily subsidized the lifeline and agriculture tube-well categories tariff thereby increasing the Government subsidy contrary to the policy to phase out the subsidy gradually.
- ii) For further monthly adjustment NEPRA may keep in view the applicable tariff rates, as per Schedule-II attached with SRO No. 1177(I)/2008, SRO No. 1178(I)/2008, SRO No. 1179(I)/2008, SRO 1180(I)/2008, SRO No. 1181(I)/2008, SRO No. 1182 (I)/2008, SRO No. 1183 (I)/2008 and SRO No. 1181 (I)/2008 dated 12-11-2008.
- 2. The Authority has considered the basis for reconsideration with respect to the Authority's decision regarding Power Purchase Adjustment for the month of November, 2008. In the Authority's opinion the basis for reconsideration request, in order to make it consistent with GOP Policy for phasing out the subsidy gradually, is valid. The GOP policy is also consistent with the standards and guidelines as per Rule 17 of Tariff Standards and Procedure Rules 1998. In view of the aforementioned, the Authority has decided to accept the Federal Government's request for reconsideration under Rule 16(12) of NEPRA Tariff Standards and Procedure Rules 1998.



- In view of the abovementioned, the Authority has decided to: 3.
 - Accept the Federal Government's request for reconsideration under i) Rule 16(12) of NEPRA Tariff Standards and Procedure Rules – 1998.
 - Exclude life-line consumers from variation of PPP in order to ii) protect from market uncertainties.
- Based on the above decision, the Authority's earlier decision dated January 1, 2009 4. on account of PPP variation for the month of November 2008 stands modified. Accordingly, the upward PPP adjustment of Rs. 0.33/kWh, as approved by the Authority shall apply to all the consumer categories except life-line residential consumer category.
