<u>Decision of the National Electric Power Regulatory Authority</u> in the matter of tariff petition filed by JDW Power (Pvt.) Ltd. (Case No. NEPRA/TRF-182/JDW-2011)

- 1. National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (hereinafter referred to as the "Authority") has determined reference generation tariff of JDW Power (Pvt.) Limited (hereinafter referred to as the "petitioner") vide determination dated April 02, 2010 (hereinafter referred to as the "original determination"). The original determination was based on budgeted Engineering Procurement and Construction (hereinafter referred to as "EPC") price, as Economic Coordination Committee of the cabinet vide decision in case no.: ECC-47/07/2009 dated March 19, 2009 has granted waiver to co-generation power projects of sugar mills utilizing coal (along with bagasse) from the requirement of having firm EPC contract for tariff determination.
- 2. The petitioner filed a fresh tariff petition (hereinafter referred to as the "petition") under rule 3 of the National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (Tariff Standards and Procedure) Rules, 1998 (hereinafter referred to as the "Tariff Rules") on July 27, 2011 for determination/adjustment of the reference generation tariff based on the signed EPC contract and the rationale/justifications provided therein.
- 3. The petition was admitted by the Authority on August 04, 2011. In accordance with sub-rule 5 of rule 4 of the Tariff Rules, the Authority gave directions for service of notices to the respondents and other parties which, in the opinion of the Authority were likely to be of assistance to the Authority in arriving at a just and informed determination, for filing comments, replies or communications in opposition or in support of the petition and to attend hearing of the petition. The hearing of the petition was held on August 25, 2011 at Islamabad.
- 4. During the course of processing of the petition, the petitioner vide letter dated November 01, 2011 intimated about its decision of putting its proposed cogeneration power project on indefinite hold pending structural improvements in the power sector and macroeconomic stability. The Authority, in response to this letter, informed the petitioner vide letter no. NEPRA/TRF-182/JDW-2011/10894 dated: November 29, 2011 that their petition is pending for adjudication by the Authority and this petition has to be decided by the Authority within the time frame provided by the Tariff Rules. However, the petitioner did not respond to this communication.







5. The Authority has therefore decided that in view of the stated intention of the petitioner to put its project on indefinite hold and its failure to respond to the Authority letter detailed above, the petition does not merit any further consideration and is hereby dismissed.
